Are You Ready For Hurricane Season?

STEP 1: DOWNLOAD THE APPS

These apps will continually notify the devices of each update before, during, and after the storm.

STEP 2: SAFETY KIT

1. 5 Days of Food Per Person
-Canned Meat, Fruit, & Vegetables
-Protein Bars
-Cereal & Dry Milk
-Peanut Butter
-Dried Fruits and Nuts
-Non-Electric Can Opener

- 2. FIRST AID & Vehicle First Aid Kits
- 3. Flashlights, BATTERIES, Candles, Matches
- 4. Supply of CASH, MEDICATIONS, & GAS
- 5. 10 Days of WATER Per Person
- 6. Fully Stocked TOILETRIES KIT

SUGGESTED: Small Generator Spray Deodorant Dry Shampoo Wipes Hand Sanitizer Mouthwash, Toothpaste, Clinical Gatorade/Powerade Hard Candy Lip Balm Lotion, etc. Water Shoes Utility Gloves Battery Operated Walkie-Talkies



STEP 3 WATERPROOF CONTAINERS

Place all valuables in WATERPROOF containers -Wills -Titles -Insurance Policies -Passports -Credit Card/Bank Information -Contact Information -Pictures etc.



STEP 4 PLAN

- 1. EVACUATION Route selected
- 2. TORNADO plan in place

3. Pre-select LODGING (Remember your pets!) 4. NOTIFY family & friends of your evacuation plans.

STEP 5: PETS

To learn about pet micro-chipping call Bay County Animal Services at 850-767-3333.

- 1. Have Three DAYS of FOOD & medication
- 2. A PICTURE of you & your pet together
- 3. CARRIER, ID, Leash, & Papers
- 4. Highly TRAINED pets are VITAL for emergency situations.

No biting, loud noises, or jumping. A trained vs. untrained pet could be the deciding factor if your pet is allowed admittance or lodging.



STEP 6: PROPERTY PREP

1. Purchase Storm Shutters/PLYWOOD

Measure Windows and Doors before this purchase, cut out the wood to size, and make sure you have the correct tools, anchors, and hardware in your personal stock.

- 2. MOVE all furniture indoors
- 3. FILL Bathtubs and sinks with water
- 4. Turn OFF utilities before you leave

It is AGAINST THE LAW for anyone other than a <u>certified</u> professional to turn gas back on. Liability could include a fire, gas leak, explosion, injury or death, and criminal prosecution.





STEP 7: EVACUATION AND RETURN

1. Follow Authorities guidelines for EVACUATION Rule of thumb for our local evacuation routes: For every 10-15 miles it takes 1 hour of drive time.

2. Pre-Select LODGING or Shelter

3. National Guard may issue mandatory CURFEWS 4. NOTIFY close family & friends, manager and boss of your plans. Stay in contact!
